Health and Safety Policy

To support our Health and Safety policy statement, Eden Dodgeball Club commit to the following duties:

- Undertake regular, recorded risk assessment of the facilities used by the club and all activities undertaken by the club.
- Create a safe environment by putting health and safety measures in place as identified by the assessment.
- Ensure that all members are given the appropriate level of training and competition by regularly assessing individual ability dependant on age, maturity and development through personal development plans.
- Ensure that all members are aware of, understand and follow the club's health and safety policy.
- Appoint a competent club member to assist with health and safety responsibilities.
- Ensure that normal operating procedures and emergency operating procedures are in place and known by all members.
- Provide access to adequate first aid facilities, a telephone and qualified first aider at all times.
- Report any injuries or accidents sustained during any club activity or whilst on premises used by the club.
- Ensure that the implementation of the policy is reviewed annually and monitored for effectiveness.

As a club member, you have a duty to:

- Take responsibility for health and safety issues as and when they arise and ensure they are recorded properly.
- Take reasonable care for your own health and safety and that of others who may be affected by what you do or not do.
- Co-operate with the club on health and safety issues.
- Correctly use all equipment provided by the club.
- Report any unsafe equipment immediately to the coach running the session who will ensure it is no longer used and properly recorded.
- Clear any hazards from a playing area immediately and report it to the coach running the session.
- Not interfere with or misuse anything provided for your health, safety or welfare.
